Work Experience Eligibility

<u>Attendance</u> - Must exceed 85% positive attendance/participation in the school year or time in which the student would like to submit hours for work experience consideration.

Behavior - The student must be in good standing behaviorally to participate.

<u>Credit Type</u> - Students must require Elective Credit.

Credit Calculation

- 20 Total Hours = 1 High School Elective Credit
 - o Up to 20 credits in a school year, up to 40 over the course of high school

Monitoring Student Progress

The success of our students relies heavily on the partnership between students, parents, and teachers. Parents and guardians play a critical role in their child's academic progress. We encourage parents to regularly monitor their child's academic performance and stay informed about their progress. By actively engaging with teachers and tracking academic achievements, parents help ensure students stay on the path to success.

El Camino Curriculum Materials & Computer Hardware

El Camino provides all necessary learning materials, including school-issued Chromebooks, access to school printers, and all required textbooks and curricular supplies. These materials are property of the school and must be maintained in good condition. Students and their families are responsible for the repair or replacement of any lost, stolen, or damaged school property.

Student Acceptable Use Policy

Students must use school computers and technology resources responsibly, always demonstrating respect for others. The following guidelines apply:

- Respectful Use: Students may not use offensive, profane, or disrespectful language.
- Academic Integrity: Plagiarism, including copying content from the Internet or other students, is prohibited.
- Email and Communication: Email is not private; students should be mindful of what they send.
- **Personal Information**: Students must not post personal information online, including addresses, phone numbers, or images.
- Unauthorized Access: Gaining unauthorized access to any computer system is illegal.
- System Integrity: Damaging or disrupting school systems or equipment is prohibited.

- Illegal Activities: Students must not use El Camino equipment for illegal activities.
- Cyberbullying: Students are prohibited from using technology to harm, intimidate, or bully others.

Cell Phone Use

Use of Cell Phones and Personal Electronic Devices

In the ever-evolving world of technology, we understand students may want to bring personal electronic devices to school. However, to ensure an optimal learning environment, the use of smartphones and other mobile devices is strictly limited during the school day.

General Guidelines

Students are strongly discouraged from bringing valuable electronics to school due to the risk of loss, damage, or theft. CRPUSD schools are not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.

In Every Classroom, With Every Teacher:

- Cell phones must be turned off and stored in the designated classroom cell phone caddy or case at the start of class.
- Earbuds or headphones may not be worn or used during instructional time unless specifically directed by the teacher.
- Phones may be used only during designated breaks or for specific, teacher-approved activities.
- Cell phones are not permitted on bathroom breaks during class.
- Cell phones may not be used as substitutes for school-issued Chromebooks during class time.
- Teachers may allow phone use for time-limited, instructional purposes at their discretion.

Student Expectations

- Silence and store your phone in the designated classroom caddy at the start of class.
- Bring your charged Chromebook to school daily.
- Leave your phone in the caddy when taking a bathroom break during class.

Consequences for Violations

In-Class Violations:

- First Offense Verbal warning from the teacher.
- Second Offense Teacher assigns detention and contacts parent/guardian.
- Third Offense and Beyond Referral to assistant principal. A parent conference may be scheduled, and the phone will be stored in the main office until the end of the day.

Out-of-Class Violations (e.g., bathroom use during class):

Phones will be confiscated and stored in the main office until the end of the school day.
 Parent/guardian will be contacted.

Refusal to Comply

If a student refuses to hand over their device when requested by school staff, a program administrator will collect it. The device will only be returned to a parent or guardian.

Privacy and Recording

Recording devices (including phone cameras and voice recorders) may not be used without prior administrative approval. To protect student and staff privacy, no images or recordings taken on campus may be shared on social media or online without explicit permission from school administration.

Attendance

Regular attendance is crucial for academic success. Students are expected to attend school every day and be on time for all classes and activities.

Cheating and Plagiarism

El Camino takes cheating and plagiarism seriously. Cheating includes copying another student's work or allowing others to copy your work. Plagiarism involves using someone else's ideas or writings as your own. Violations will result in appropriate consequences.

Octomester Schedule

Our continuation school operates on an octomester system instead of traditional semesters or quarters. The school year is divided into eight short terms called *octomesters*. During each octomester, students typically take 2–3 classes and can earn up to 11 credits per term.

This schedule allows students to focus on fewer classes at a time and to recover credits more quickly.
